



The Government of Jamaica (GOJ) has approved a new Public-Private Partnership (PPP) tender for the Norman Manley International Airport (NMIA) in keeping with its policy to divest the entity.

The GOJ is committed to partnering with an experienced private sector investor with proven experience in the aviation sector to operate, finance, develop and maintain the NMIA under a long term concession agreement.

In 2015, the government shortlisted five entities but no bids were received at the close of the bidding period,

An invitation for prequalification applications is expected to be launched by early December 2016.
